

Admission of international study applicants 2013

The Berlin Weissensee Art Academy offers four different study options:

1. As a direct student or full-time student in a regular study program acc. to the valid regulations concerning application and admission

- after having passed successfully the artistic aptitude test (entrance test)
- if you are changing universities after successful presentation before the admissions commission of your chosen course of study, with a recommendation of the appropriate semester for admission
- only students who can submit a language certificate for German as a foreign language can matriculate (Test-DaF or DSH)

2. As a transfer student

- supply proof of having completed at least two semesters in a comparable program
- fulfill all criteria for admission to the desired program at the Berlin Academy of Art Weissensee
- successfully complete the examination process for transfer admission
- German language proof (Testaf, DSH etc) Language of instruction is German.

3. As an exchange student for 1 to 2 semesters

- as part of an exchange programme, which the Academy of Art Weissensee has with approx. 60 international academies and art schools.
- if you are interested, please first of all contact the International
- Exchange Office of your own art school, which will inform you about the conditions for application and send your documents to Berlin.
- after examining your application documents and approval by the teaching staff of the Berlin Weissensee Art Academy you will receive a letter of acceptance

4. As a scholarship holder from national and international foundations

- with recommendation or placement by a foundation for 1 to 2 semesters
- registration at the Akademisches Auslandsamt (International Office) of the Berlin Weissensee Art Academy , Bühringstrasse 20, D-13086 Berlin, Germany

A German language certificate is not absolutely necessary for the international study applicants outlined in points 3 and 4. However, it is nevertheless advisable that you understand the German language.
