weißensee - art academy of the future

The weißensee academy of art berlin was founded in 1946 as an alternative to the traditional academy. Originating from the teachings and ideas of the Bauhaus, the university is characterized by its unique profile: It offers more than 800 students from Germany and abroad a one-year interdisciplinary foundation course.

The basic artistic and design courses are followed by diploma courses in fine arts as well as Bachelor's and Master's courses in design. The classless system is flanked by in-depth, research-based teaching in theory and history. Students can graduate in the fields of sculpture, stage and costume design, painting, fashion design, product design, textile and surface design and visual communication. The range of courses is complemented by the two postgraduate Master's courses in Art Therapy and Spatial Strategies.

In addition to the individual subject areas, the 19 excellently equipped workshops and studios offer training in the craft of printing, casting, weaving and knitting techniques as well as in solid digital technologies. The university's research laboratories focus on experimental research and networks on sustainable design strategies, media and information technologies.

The design degree programs work in numerous supra-regional research and cooperation projects on forward-looking and innovative design processes and solutions on the topics of climate, environment, sustainability, textiles, fashion, living and mobility. In view of the optimization of our living and working environment and a radical culture of algorithms, the liberal arts address social, cultural and art-immanent issues, produce resistant thinking and develop alternative strategies and visions.

Through support initiatives for alumni, including business start-ups, the studio program and scholarships from the

Mart Stam Gesellschaft, the university provides the best conditions for the transition from studying to working. It thus makes a significant contribution to strengthening young creative talent and developing the art and cultural landscape of the science city of Berlin.

Based on the four central competencies for 21st century learners and teachers - creativity, collaboration, communication and critical thinking - the students and members of the university see themselves as an international community that promotes social and intellectual dialog through practice-oriented collaboration.

Guaranteed by fundamental rights, the weißensee academy of art berlin, as an autonomous university, shapes the freedom of art and science in research and teaching. On the basis of its political self-image, the university is committed to equal opportunities, gender equality, diversity and inclusion and thus to the dismantling of structural barriers. It positions itself against right-wing extremism, anti-democracy and discrimination. As a social place, even in times of crisis, the university promotes a culture of togetherness.

With its interdisciplinary teaching and research in the fields of art, design and science, the weißensee academy of art berlin offers an excellent study program. Its artistic and creative development projects contribute significantly to relevant social change processes and its cultural discourses.

The study programmes of weißeSee:

Fashion Design, Product Design, Textile and Material Design & Visual Communication offer an 8-semester Bachelor's program (240 ECTS), after which you can apply for the two-year Master's program (120 ECTS).

The diploma programs in Fine Arts with the fields of study: Painting, Sculpture and Stage and Costume Design comprise a standard period of study of ten semesters and you will graduate with a diploma (300 ECTS). All undergraduate degree courses start with a one-year foundation course in art and design.

The Master's degree course in Spatial Strategies lasts 4 semesters and 120 ECTS are acquired here.

The postgraduate Master's degree course in Art Therapy is a three-year, part-time course that is completed with 180 ECTS.

Admission always takes place in the winter semester with the start of studies in October. For university transfer students (from the 3rd semester) can apply for the summer and winter semesters.

Foundation Course (first year of studies)

The foundation year are completed by students from all degree courses together in mixed groups and are one of the special features that define the profile of the weißeSee academy of art berlin and, in addition to elementary artistic knowledge, are intended to enable communicative action that goes beyond the individual degree course. Students can test sensual-immediate and analytical-systematic working methods in a practical comparison and reflect on them theoretically. The central subject is the teaching of the fundamentals of art and design.

In addition to the necessary technical skills, creative and artistic processes are experienced from as many different perspectives as possible in lively practice. Basic courses: Drawing, Visual Artistic Design, Spatial and Plastic Design, Digital Media, Anatomy/Morphology and Photography.

Studio Workshops

In addition to the individual departments, the 19 excellently equipped workshops and studios offer training in the craft of printing, casting, weaving and knitting techniques as well as in solid digital technologies. The academy's research laboratories focus on experimental research and networks on sustainable design strategies and media and information technologies. In the workshops, artists and designers can try out artistic and creative designs on models or objects. In the workshops, artists and designers can try out artistic and creative designs on models or objects. The workshops provide an introduction to basic craft skills and have the material equipment for the most important techniques.

There is a bookbindery, a screen printing, gravure printing and lithography workshop, an Elab for interactive technologies, a wood, ceramics and metal workshop, a model making workshop, a metal welding workshop and a photography workshop. The academy also has its own library, a equipment rental and a computer study with a wide range of printing facilities.

Theory and history

„Theory and History“ is compulsory for all students from the first semester onwards. The aim is to be able to recognize the difference between academy-based learning and independent study right from the start. For this reason, almost all courses in the study programs are compulsory elective courses for the entire duration of the study. Basic historical and theoretical knowledge is taught in the first study phase. During this study phase, the course „Introduction to

Academic Work“ is compulsory once. In the second study phase, courses are offered for advanced students that deal with more specific topics and thus impart more detailed and in-depth knowledge. When choosing courses, students should not only consider their future career choice, but also the possibility of acquiring comprehensive knowledge.

Study abroad

The weißensee academy of art and design berlin has an intensive student exchange program with more than 120 partner universities and academies in Europe, Asia, the USA and Canada. We recommend that students spend a semester abroad. This allows them to expand their professional skills in a different teaching and learning culture. They also prepare themselves for an increasingly international job market. Students in the second stage of their studies can find out about exchange places on the ERASMUS program or other opportunities to study abroad at the International Office of weißensee academy of art,.

Master's program

Graduates who have successfully completed their bachelor's degree have the opportunity to continue with a four-semester master's program. The MA program aims to further develop students' design identity and creative visions at the highest level. The focus is on project-oriented teaching.

The application period for the master's design programs is from March 1 to April 30. Admission is only for the winter semester. Further information can be found at: www.kh-berlin.de under >Application >Study application >MA Design

APPLICATION PROCESS FOR THE UNDERGRADE DEGREE PROGRAMS (BA DESIGN AND FINE ARTS)

November 1 to January 5 2027 (12:00 noon)
Start of studies: winter semester 2027/28

Please note: applications for the undergraduate degree programs are only made once a year and admission is only granted for the winter semester, starting in October.

We recommend that you start your application early so that you can receive the assignment and guidelines for the portfolio, and clarify any questions you may have about the application.

In addition, students in the Fashion Design, Product Design, and Visual Communication programs will be assigned a homework assignment. This assignment will not be assigned until an application has been submitted (message in Campuscore). To ensure you have enough time to complete the assignment, it is advisable to apply in a timely manner.

After creating your user account in the campus management system (CMS), you can create your application in the desired department and fill out the forms.

Together with your application, you also upload your digital portfolio, which includes your artistic or design work.

In the next section you will find further information on the application documents and portfolio submission.

The application deadline as well as the digital portfolio submission ends on Tuesday, January 5, 2027 at 12:00 noon (CET).

After the application deadline, the respective admissions committee will review your portfolio. Based on your work, the next step is to decide whether you will take part in the entrance exam.

If you pass the portfolio examination, you will receive an invitation to the artistic entrance exam at the end of January, which is expected to take place between 16 and 20 February 2026. We will inform you of the exact date in the invitation letter.

The artistic entrance exam will include both practical tasks and an interview with the admissions committee. This will be based on your portfolio and your motivation.

Once you have passed the exam, you will receive a letter of admission and enrolment instructions via the online portal; all original documents - such as your degree certificate - will be submitted in March.

Application documents / digital portfolio submission

Together with your application, you must upload a digital portfolio and, if applicable, a homework assignment (in the design departments) by January 5.

We recommend that you start your application early so that you can receive the assignment and guidelines for the portfolio, and clarify any questions you may have about the application.

The following documents must be uploaded with the online application:

- Curriculum vitae with details of your previous school or study history, internships, jobs and work experience in the field relevant to your studies
- Letter of motivation (in the departments Painting and Sculpture)
- School leaving certificate (if already available, can be submitted later)
- only for the BA program Fashion Design: a previous professional training or pre-study internship of at least 6 - 8 weeks (if available, can be submitted later).
- for international applicants:
a German language certificate or a confirmation of the current language course at at least A2 level; and to enroll, you'll need the B2 exam certificate, and for costume- and stage design the C1 certificate.

General notes on portfolio creation

Apart from the number of approx. 20 artistic or creative works, no topics or forms are specified by the departments. The individual design of the portfolio is important.

In addition to your artistic aptitude and creativity, it should also reflect your interest in the desired department. A good selection of works is crucial, as the first task when applying for a place at art academy is to take a close look at your own artistic identity, talents and objectives. It is not the quantity that is important, but a consciously curated selection. Choose your strongest works that combine technical skill, creative concepts and diversity in medium and expression and show your creative depth. Artistic and creative work samples that demonstrate a certain continuity and intensity are very welcome.

More over, you can also include short texts, such as sketches or explanatory descriptions. In these, you explain the idea behind a work, a creative piece or a project, the steps you have taken, the questions you have pursued and the techniques you have used. In this way, you provide an insight into your creative process and show that you are critical of your working methods. In addition, drawings and sketchbooks are highly valued in all degree courses, as they are an important medium for visualizing and developing ideas and concepts.

Our student projects and works on the website and the tour in July can serve as inspiration. We also recommend that you actively seek feedback. Visit our portfolio consultations and information days! Creative people in your area can also support you.

ARTISTIC ENTRANCE EXAM

Date: February 15 - 19, 2027

Location: weißensee academy of art berlin
The invitation to the artistic entrance examination with the exact information and notes on the examination days will be sent to all accepted applicants (after the portfolio review) by e-mail at the end of January.

The one to three-day examination serves to determine the required aptitude. In addition to practical artistic tasks, it also includes an interview with the admissions committee, which usually relates to the portfolio, professional development and motivation of the participants.

International applicants who require a visa are requested to request confirmation of their application for the examination in good time.

Applicants with physical or mental disabilities, special needs or chronic illness can apply for compensation for disadvantages before the exam. We will be happy to advise you on this. Admission

Admission to the course can only be granted after passing the entrance exam. Suitable applicants will receive an application for admission, which must be sent with the relevant documents by March 31. There is no allocation of study places via the Foundation for academy Admission, according to numerus clausus values, waiting semesters or lottery procedures. Once the admission procedure has been completed, applicants are informed in writing of their admission and receive the enrolment forms. Proof of artistic aptitude, which is acquired through the examination, remains valid for three years.

Admission requirements

- Proof of general higher education entrance qualification, applicants without a high school diploma can also be admitted to the course if they provide evidence of particular artistic talent in the entrance examination

- artistic aptitude
(passed entrance examination)

- only for the BA program Fashion Design: a previous professional training or pre-study internship of at least 6 - 8 weeks (if available, can be submitted later).

- for international applicants:
proof of German language proficiency, z. e.g. TestDaF 3, DSH 1, telc B2 or the B2 certificate of the Goethe-Institut

> Proof of language proficiency at level A2 is sufficient for application. The corresponding examination certificate should be provided by the enrollment in July/August. Native German speakers and applicants who have a German Abitur or a German university degree are exempt.

Transfer Students

A transfer to weißensee kunsthochschule berlin is possible after completion of the second semester in a comparable degree program. The application for a transfer must be submitted online via the Campuscore application portal. This is possible in December for the summer semester and in May for the winter semester. The admissions committee of the department decides on admission and semester classification.

Whether the procedure will be opened for the respective semester is always announced shortly before the start of applications. It is advisable to contact the student advisory service beforehand.

Information on guest auditors

Students who wish to deepen their professional knowledge or their studies and meet the necessary requirements for participation in the courses can apply for guest auditor.

Unfortunately, guest auditors cannot be accepted in most artistic and creative departments. This applies in particular to those interested in using the guest student status to prepare for future artistic or design studies. The head of the course decides on participation, provided there is space available. Registrations should be made at the beginning of each semester.

It is important that the level of education corresponds to the requirements of the course, which can be proven by work samples after consultation with the respective professors. The professors of the department will then also -after a personal interview.

Admission is granted for one semester at a time and should not exceed 10 semester hours per week. Guest auditors do not have student status. Admission is not possible in courses with limited places. There is no entitlement to an examination.

All prospective students are advised to inform themselves comprehensively about the course content and to contact the departments. The approval of the professors is only given after a personal interview. Important

- complete transfer of the participation fee
